The Property is Purchased?



GraceWay Village (GWV) achieved a significant milestone in its quest to build and operate a **Family Restorative Living Facility** by purchasing the property on Hartman Road from Indian River Presbyterian Church (IRPC). The planned facility will offer families threatened with homelessness a safe place to live while they work diligently to become self-sufficient.

The deed transfer took place on June 16, 2021. Lead donors, **William and Estelle Turney**, are pictured on the left with GWV CEO, Cathie Mouring. On the right are **David Sowerby**, **Esq.**, who has shared his skills from GWV's inception, GWV Board Chair Mary Beth Cullins, and GWV Chief of Operations, Chrystal Netherton.

Started by Indian River Presbyterian Church (IRPC) in 2009, GraceWay Village became independent in 2016. The hearts of those involved from the beginning to those currently striving hard to serve at GWV are eloquently expressed by David Sowerby: "It feels like IRPC gave birth with great love to GWV. With independence came the adoption where great love clearly remains."

"We are deeply appreciative of all of our supporters who made this purchase possible, especially the Turney's who have been actively involved in GWV for several years," explained Cathie. "The community support exemplified by such generosity will be the foundation of getting this restorative facility built!"

You are doing a great work here!"* In response to the Family Restorative Living Facility presentation, she added, *"The need is so huge, especially the needs for job training and child care.
